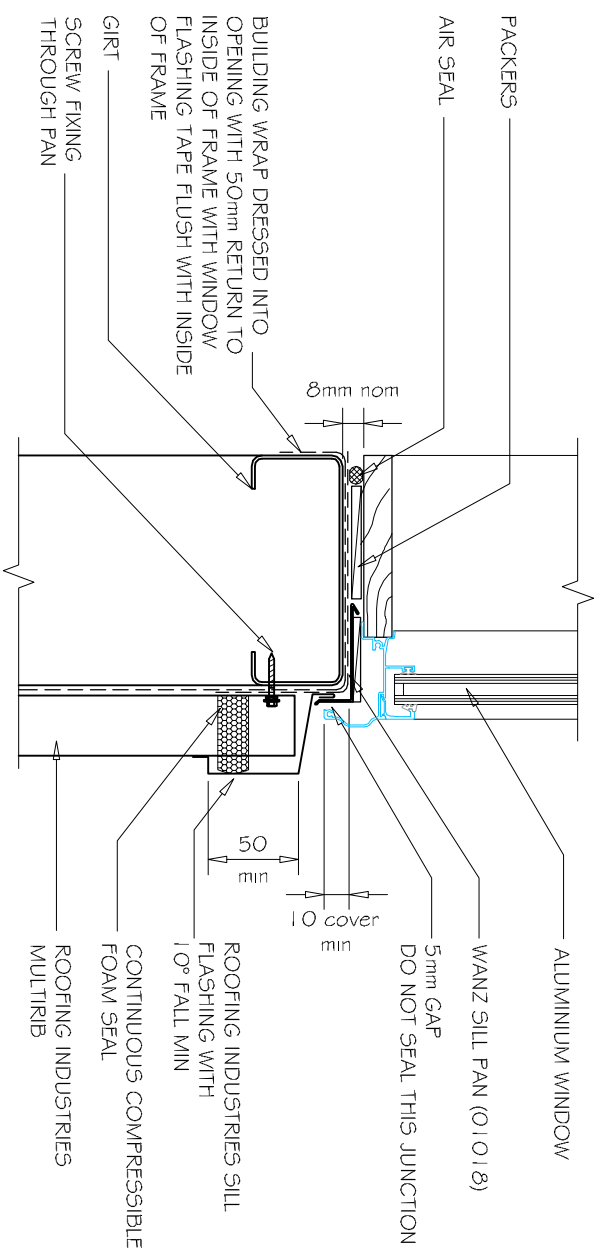


COMMERCIAL WINDOW / DOOR SILL FLASHING FOR MULTIRIB VERTICAL CLADDING. (Recessed Window / Door)

GENERAL NOTES:

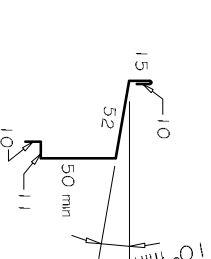
- (1) REFER TO E2/A5.1 OR WANZ W15 FOR GENERAL WINDOW OPENING FOR WRAPPING
- (2) WINDOW PROFILE TO BE SELECTED TO ACHIEVE COVER SHOWN IN DETAILS.
- (3) ARCHITRAVES ARE SHOWN FOR CONSISTENCY ONLY. DETAIL MAY BE USED WITH REBATED LINER.
- (4) WHERE SUPPORT BRACKETS ARE REQUIRED BY THE WINDOW MANUFACTURER TO CARRY THE FRAME AND GLAZING LOADS THEY MUST BE SUPPLIED AS AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE WINDOW MANUFACTURERS RECOMMENDATIONS.
- (5) LAGS WITH WINDOW MANUFACTURER PRIOR TO INSTALLATION.

- Underlay selection and building wrap types are the responsibility of the designer, Alternative support to galvanised netting should be used in severe coastal environments including when aluminum is used.
